  - a. June-August Financials

Alberta Education revenue \$912,413.

613K decrease in 2022-23 due to overestimate enrollment fees.

In June, the Charlton Family donated \$2,000.

Central admin staff need to use the outcome-based salary. Hire new support if needed in order to avoid working overtime. Superintendent plans to have vacation this year instead of paying out.

Yearbook sales is 2X the revenue this year. Power school submission the fees make it easier.

Discussion between board members:

We need more discussion about the parent payout. It looks like we are encouraging students not taking school bus.

Some parents cannot afford busing for \$735 each kid.

Get more clarity with the transportation funding manual. Put this in the agenda of the next meeting.

#### b. Finance & Audit Committee

Minimum 5 individuals, shall include 2 members who are not directors. The Committee shall meet 4 times a year, and may call as required.

#### c. External Audit

Audit starts to come in the first week of October. The target is having a draft at the end of the September. Final will be in November.

# 4. Superintendent Report (Ian Gray) 8:00 PM

### a. Transportation

We currently have 17 buses and will add 2 more by the next few weeks. It took 2 extra weeks to settle down this year. 68% of students are on buses this year. The challenge is to get bus drivers. The school is looking into programs that can digitize bus routines.

Transportation Committee
 Some suggested to make a formal committee, board members will sit on it.
 Ian needs to inform the board when the assisting needed.

2 weeks is reasonable if parents request changes.

Some suggested that before making decision, make sure we have information from all aspects.

Some suggested that the board should not interact with the committee.

Budget more buses, 24-25 buses. Plan the bus routes early ahead not leaving it until the end of summer.

### b. Research

Dr. Walson and Ian will still work on Journal of Education Research. Ian found a good online repository of their work.

c. Northern Alberta Charter Leadership Network

Mother earth Charter School is struggling this year, down to 16 students, may shut down.

d. Dual Credit Grant

We received \$50,000 grant this year for NAIT Elite Duo credits program. They will have a meeting to finalize it.

#### e. Facilities

- Project Management for Secondary School Received \$50,000, need \$20,000 more for Capital planning.
- ii. Park West Facility
  Looking for opportunities to rent it out, but it will be a challenge.

#### f. School Fees

Discussion around if we should post the option fees along with the school fees initially or the school will eat the cost. What will it look like if the school will cover all/part of the fees? Also, suggestion that we set a cap for the school fees.
